We recognize the special accomplishments of **Helen Choi** and **Hiroko Oyama** who each provided over 15 years of service and made ATASK what it is today. We wish them the best in the new phases of their lives.

Thanks to generous support from public and private sources, committed Board leadership, and the hard work of staff and volunteers, the Asian Task Force Against Domestic Violence has expanded on the vision of our founder and built one of the most vital non-profits in the Greater Boston, Massachusetts, and New England areas. Incorporated in 1992, ATASK is a \$1.5M United Way affiliated agency. We are the only provider in New England of shelter and support services for Asian survivors of domestic violence and their families.

Our mission is to prevent domestic violence and to provide hope to survivors

ATASK's staff speaks over 12 Asian languages and dialects and has a deep cultural understanding of our service populations. We provide:

Housing and helpline

- ✿ ATASK operates a 7-room emergency shelter in a confidential location in the Greater Boston area. In 2009, ATASK provided nearly 6000 bed days in our shelter, serving 54 women, men, and children.
- ✿ ATASK operates a multilingual helpline for emergency assistance, support, and information. In 2009, staff responded to over 450 helpline calls, providing important links to shelter beds and advocacy support, 24/7/365.

Outreach

- ✿ ATASK conducts trainings for local police departments and medical and dental providers as well as dating violence prevention sessions for youth in area schools, serving thousands of participants annually.
- ✿ ATASK communicates with community members, service providers, and business owners throughout Massachusetts about domestic violence in Asian families and communities.
- ✿ ATASK works with its colleagues at the Multicultural Coalition Against Domestic Violence (MICA), the Teen Dating Violence Prevention Network, and Allies Working with Asian Pacific American Youth Network (A-WAY) to prevent violence.

Programs and services

- ✿ ATASK operates community-based services in Boston and Lowell. In 2009, community-based advocates (serving Cambodian, Chinese, Filipino, Korean, South Asian, Vietnamese and other clients), assisted 450 clients with safety planning, housing, healthcare, public benefits, employment, immigration and legal issues, mental health referrals, financial literacy, and other life skills. Staff responded to over 7000 advocacy calls.
- ✿ ATASK provides our clients with referrals to attorneys working with survivors of domestic violence for consultation and representation through our legal advocacy program.
- ✿ ATASK teaches clients financial literacy and other life skills, including English for Speakers of Other Languages. In 2009 staff provided 750 hours of group and individual instruction to our clients.

Education

- ✿ ATASK launched a new Youth Empowerment Program in 2009, mentoring 15 Asian-American teens to become peer leaders in preventing violence in their communities.
- ✿ ATASK provides teen dating violence workshops to students in schools and afterschool programs in Boston and will begin a similar program in Greater Lowell in 2010.
- ✿ ATASK, in collaboration with community partners, trains volunteers as part of the Greater Boston Domestic Violence Coalition.

In 2009 ATASK was selected as the only organization in Massachusetts to receive funding from:

- The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (one of eight in the nation participating in the "Strengthening What Works" initiative to prevent intimate partner violence in immigrant and refugee populations)
- The Office on Violence Against Women of the U.S. Department of Justice (one of 46 awardees nationwide in their initiative to expand cultural and linguistic access for domestic violence survivors)

In 2009 we built an advanced website (www.atask.org) to provide readily accessible information to those impacted by domestic violence and to further our work, mission and vision by facilitating communication with supporters and friends of ATASK across the globe.

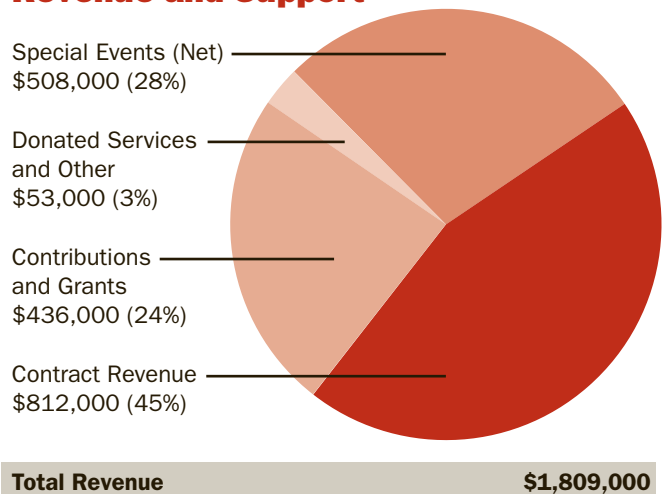
