Dear Friends,

Thanks to the help of friends old and new, 2010 was another wonderful year for the Asian Task Force Against Domestic Violence (ATASK) to carry out its mission of preventing domestic violence in Asian families and communities, and providing hope to survivors. This year, ATASK also reinforced its commitment to future generations of children and youth, and of professional staff.

Our new children's outreach message, "Peaceful Homes Let Children Soar," was developed by staff and trusted community experts. The accompanying artwork, created by children's book author/illustrator Grace Lin, is cheerful and optimistic. The underlying statistics that prompted our actions, however, are sobering: reportedly, 1 in 5 children witness violence in their homes, and often the cycle of violence repeats itself into adulthood.

Along these lines, our Youth Empowerment Project expanded in size to include more Asian youth of diverse backgrounds and of a broader geography. Youth demonstrated their passion, energy, and leadership skills by launching the first Denim Day in the Boston area. Our continued participation in the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation's "Strengthening What Works" initiative shows that we are on the right track.

ATASK capped off its year with the wonderful news that several staff members earned well-deserved recognition. Van Chey, retired Lowell Advocate, was one of five Local Heroes named by Bank of America through its 2010 Neighborhood Excellence Initiative. Helen Choi, retired Chinese Advocate, received the "Boston Community Pioneer Award" from the Mayor's Office of New Bostonians. Additionally, Sujata Ghosh, Program Coordinator for Direct Services, and Qingjian Shi, Director of Education and Outreach, were selected as research training fellows for the Tufts Clinical and Translational Science Institute, a collaborative program of Tufts University, Boston University, and Harvard University.

We thank you for all you do to help us further our mission and vision, and look forward to seeing you in 2011. Together we can prevent domestic violence, and help our clients, children, staff, and the entire organization soar.

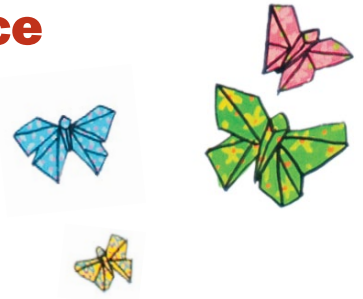

This annual report is dedicated to the beloved memory of Joan Cutler, Ernest Do, and Pam Whitney.

Our Mission is to prevent domestic violence in Asian families and communities, and to provide hope to survivors.



ATASK's staff speak over 12 Asian languages and dialects and have a deep cultural understanding of our service populations. We provide:

Housing and Helpline

- ATASK operates a 7-room emergency shelter in a confidential location in the Greater Boston area. In 2010, ATASK provided over 7,500 bed days in our shelter, serving 48 clients — 23 women and 25 children.
- ATASK manages a multilingual helpline for emergency assistance, support, and information. In 2010, staff responded to over 400 helpline calls, providing important links to shelter beds and advocacy support, 24/7/365.

Outreach

- ATASK communicates with community members, service providers, and business owners throughout Massachusetts, spreading information about available services.
- In 2010, ATASK staff distributed 11,620 domestic violence resources to community members, faith organizations, cultural centers, ethnically-owned businesses, law enforcement agencies, health care providers, and social service organizations.



Programs and Services

- ATASK operates community-based services in Boston and Lowell. In 2010, community-based advocates (serving Cambodian, Chinese, Filipino, Korean, South Asian, Vietnamese, and other clients) assisted 628 adults and children with safety planning, housing, healthcare, public benefits, employment, immigration and legal issues, mental health referrals, financial literacy, and other life skills.
- In 2010, Asian Women's Empowerment Program assisted 12 ATASK clients with workforce readiness skills, taught by 7 Suffolk University students.
- ATASK's Legal Advocacy Program provides clients with immediate access to legal advice and improved coordination of legal services and representation in an environment that helps alleviate their anxiety, where they feel safe and properly accommodated both linguistically and culturally.
- Through the English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) and community-based programs, ATASK staff and volunteers provided group and individual instruction in English, financial literacy, computer literacy, and other life skills.
- The Children and Families Program provides assessment, in-house counseling, case management, and follow-up for residents in the shelter.

Education

- In 2010, ATASK provided culturally and linguistically-specific domestic violence education to 255 community members in Boston and Lowell, and trained 1,180 service providers, including local police departments, and medical and dental providers, in Massachusetts.
- ATASK's Teen Dating Violence Program reached 512 Greater Boston and Greater Lowell teens in 2010.
- ATASK trained 22 Asian American youth through our Youth Empowerment Project (YEP). In April 2010, YEP held Denim Day, a campaign based on wearing and using denim jeans as a tool to fight against rape and violence in our communities, and distributed over 800 denim patches to Greater Boston youth.

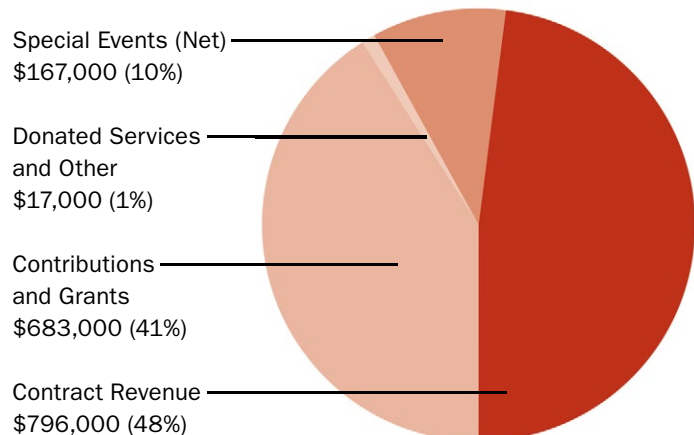
