When I came here to the U.S. from Vietnam, I had a dream to raise a family and to open my own tailoring business. I was having problems with my husband and his family. An investigation by the Department of Children and Families helped me understand that my husband was abusing me and my son. ATASK found space for us in the shelter, but to me "shelter" meant a "dark place." It was a wonderful surprise to walk through those doors because the staff welcomed me and my child. I felt safe. They helped me learn English, get job skills, use transportation, and make a budget. They helped my son with school. I now live on my own, my son is in kindergarten, and I am working in two places as a tailor. I am confident that my dream will come true because of all the help and support I've received from ATASK.

She is working full-time, apprenticing at a daycare to gain experience, and in 2011 she began the process of getting licensure to start her own!

Another student who joined us as an intermediate speaker and left as an advanced one, transitioned to a challenging Biotechnical Services training program, graduated as a valedictorian, and now works in the research department of a local university.
